IMPROVEMENTS TO THE GREENWAY IN CATON - Thank you to the residents who visited the display or commented on the proposals. The next stage is for the Parish Council to apply to LEAF for funding to help carry out the work.

COUNCILLORS - The Parish Council needs additional councillors, as it is under strength. The next elections are due in May 2023 but if you would like to get involved before that, the Parish Council has powers to coopt. If you are interested please contact the Parish Clerk or speak to a current councillor.

HORNBY ROAD CAR PARK - The renewal of the lease has been agreed, and work will be done to improve the car park surface. Costs will be shared between the Parish Council and Lancashire Highways.

WARMING PLACES FOR THE WINTER - Several organisations in the villages are considering how they can help by providing places where residents can keep warm over the coming winter. We'll try to keep you up-to-date on this.

WEEDS IN GUTTERS AND PAVEMENTS - Lancashire Highways reports carrying out one round of spraying and will do a follow-up. Lancaster City Council's street cleaning teams are expected to remove dead weeds in due course. Some strimming of road verges has been done too

SPEEDING ON BROOKHOUSE ROAD - Lancashire Police carried out a speed monitoring exercise on Brookhouse Road at the end of August and found a number of motorists exceeding the 20mph limit.

NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN

Our Neighbourhood Plan is still with the Independent Examiner, who is doing a thorough job. She raised a number of issues which the Parish Council considered at its July and September meetings. The final stage should be a referendum in the Parish, we hope at the end of this year.

STATION ROAD WILDFLOWER PATCHES

The wildflower patches at the end of Station Road have now had their end of season cut, and the gradual restoration of these areas will continue. Still very much a 'work in progress', our Environment Group, all local volunteers, aims to increase the number and variety of flowers over time whilst naturally suppressing vigorous grass growth. Many hundreds of plug plants have been dug in, and the early spring showing was a great success. Disappointment struck when Travellers put their horse to graze on a glorious summer flowering and churned one site to mud! Many thanks to Erica Sarney for donating even more plants to rescue the situation. Hungry horse aside, the wildflowers have been a welcome source of food for a wide range of pollinators, many of which are in serious decline. Grow Caton now includes experienced growers as well as four families trying to fit growing veg around raising kids. We hope to be able to encourage and support each other and perhaps even all meet up one day when the gardens are at rest. B4RN HYPERFAST BROADBAND

The Caton & Brookhouse group held a small celebration in September to thank key volunteers for their help, hard work and support in getting B4RN into the village. Thanks to everybody who has helped over the years.

Caton Update - We are still patiently waiting for all to be put in place to complete the last area of Caton down Ball Lane. Everyone else in the village has B4RN full fibre, 1Gb broadband available whenever they want to connect. If your contract is coming to an end and you would like to switch to B4RN, go to the "GETB4RN" page on the B4RN website and fill in your details to let B4RN know you would like connection. Vouchers are still available from DCMS to help with the cost so you would need to respond to the GOV.UK email. It can take a few weeks to complete the final connection so do apply in good time before your contract expires.

Brookhouse Update - If you're new to the village and aren't aware of B4RN Community fibre broadband then please check out b4rn.org.uk If you're in an existing long-term contract with another provider with less than 12 months to run, you'll be able to get B4RN for £5 a month until that contract runs out with B4RN's Connect+. Note that your Connect+ application MUST be approved before you go live as you can't apply retrospectively.

You can still get B4RN and government funding is available to help B4RN get the service to you. To get started with B4RN complete a service request at b4rn.org.uk/getb4rn
